Background

Pollinators underpin food security, livelihoods, biodiversity, and ecosystem resilience worldwide, yet their data, knowledge and information on conservation actions remain fragmented across regions, taxa, and policy domains. Increasing calls from governments, scientists, practitioners, and civil society highlight the need for a more coordinated, inclusive, evidence/knowledge-driven approaches to pollinator conservation.

The **Commission on Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture (CGRFA)**, endorsed by the FAO Conference, has repeatedly emphasized the vital role of pollinators in ensuring the ecosystem integrity and productivity and sustainability of agrifood systems, and has therefore called for the establishment of a global pollinator platform. On **16-17 September 2026**, FAO will convene a Global Pollinator Conference at its headquarters in Rome (Italy) to consider the next steps in the establishment of the Global Pollinator Platform.
